TRE to host adaptive car-building event for children with the Colorado Springs Switchbacks

Two area toddlers will receive brand new customized wheels that help them make developmental strides

The Resource Exchange (TRE) will host a unique and fun event Friday, June 18, 2021 with two small teams of therapists, technicians, and volunteers from the Colorado Springs Switchbacks! Each build team will assemble and customize a miniature ride-on motorized car designed to give increased mobility to two area toddlers with developmental disabilities or delays who cannot walk unassisted.

WHAT: The Resource Exchange Go Baby Go! "Build Day"

WHEN: Friday, June 18, 2021

10:00 AM-11:30 AM: Parents will decorate the cars, and therapists will make final modifications to the small, motorized cars built that morning by a team of volunteers before the children take them for a spin.

The best photo opportunities will be between 10:30-11:30 AM.

(event will take place in the indoor lower level lobby at the north entrance of the building)

OF NOTE:

- "Ziggy" the Switchbacks mascot is scheduled to make an appearance.
- One of the children receiving a vehicle is also celebrating a birthday.
- Go Baby Go! cars are free to TRE families and give children the opportunity to direct their own movement, many for the first time.
- TRE therapists incorporate the vehicle into the child's ongoing personalized development plan to help the child meet developmental milestones and explore the world around them in new ways.
