#### **Federal Budget Updates**

The US House passed its budget resolution, which calls for the Energy and Commerce Committee to make cuts of at least \$880 billion, including consideration of cuts to the Medicaid program. Strong advocacy is being coordinated to educate elected officials on the importance of Medicaid for people with disabilities. Colorado works closely with ANCOR, a national organization focused on shaping policy to support people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Through their advocacy and other state efforts, Speaker Johnson (R-LA) said last Wednesday that per capita caps and lowering the FMAP are now "off the table." This was also reiterated by Rep.Guthrie (R-KY), chair of the House Energy and Commerce Committee.

#### **State Budget Updates**

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) continues to complete figure setting activities with HCPF. Currently, they have included funds for caseload growth. They will continue to work over the next 2 weeks to balance the budget. As a result, final information on what impacts may be seen for HCBS are not known at this time.

#### **HCPF and State Budget Updates**

- MedRide Update MedRide received a temporary restraining order which means that they will
  continue services through March 6. The order does not currently authorize MedRide to provide service
  beyond that date. Non-Emergent Medical Transportation (NEMT) Service Areas | Department of Health
  Care Policy and Financing. Members can also call 800-221-3943 to get help finding an NEMT provider.
- Medicaid Buy-In Program Premium Payments Monthly premium payments for the Medicaid Buy-In Program will start again in May, 2025. Initial notifications have been sent to recipients. Payments, based on monthly income, will need to be paid in order for a Member to maintain Medicaid under this program. A premium letter will be sent in April to recipients stating the amount owed each month. First month payment will be due by May 15, 2025. Payments can be made online or with a check or money order.

<u>Cover All Coloradans</u> – HCPF has released information on Cover All Coloradans, a program to expand
health coverage to children and pregnant people, no matter what their immigration status is. HCPF is
monitoring federal laws that could impact this program and will continue to provide updates - <u>Cover All

#### **TRE Updates**

- <u>Interim Support Level Assessment (ISLA) Tool</u> Training for assessors to use the ISLA is beginning in March. HCPF has confirmed with TRE that there will be a complaint process. Additional details as to the rollout of this tool will be provided as soon as they are known.
- <u>TRE Vault Data System and Member/Provider Portal</u> There will be a Vault Training for provider organizations during the regular Provider Executive Meeting in March.
  - TRE Vault Phase 1 Rollout and Training
  - Thursday, March 27, 8:30-10:00
  - TRE Vault phase 1 rollout is an essential initiative designed to enhance the referral processes within various agencies. As part of this rollout, TRE will be conducting a vital training session to ensure all representatives are well-versed in he new system and its functionalities.
  - It is recommended that each provider organization sends a representative to this training.
     Specifically, the individual responsible for handling referrals within your organization should be present at this training.
- <u>Colorado Developmental Disability Council (CDDC) Survey</u> CDDC is doing research on future housing options for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. They are seeking individuals and family members to participate in focus groups in April in the Colorado Springs area. A flyer is attached to this newsletter providing more information. Please help recruit individuals for this survey/focus group.
- <u>TRE Emails</u> Due to growth in staff at TRE, the organization is moving to a new format for email addresses for new staff. Existing staff will maintain their current emails. However, new staff will begin to have addresses with the format <a href="mailto:firstname.lastname@tre.org">firstname.lastname@tre.org</a>.

- Colorado Developmental Disability Council (CDDC) is seeking individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and family members to participate in focus groups in April on future housing needs in Colorado Springs. - Anyone receiving Medicaid through the Medicaid Buy-In Program should expect a notification of a
  premium payment for this benefit. They will receive notification of this as well as a statement of the
  amount owed in April. The first month payment, based on income, will be due May 15, 2025.
- Stay Positive Research shows that maintaining a hopeful mindset can improve well-being, strengthen problem-solving skills, and inspire others. The Pikes Peak and Pueblo regions are working together to support families and empower them. 
## **What The Acronyms Mean**

- Acronym Guide: Office Of Community Living Acronym Glossary | Colorado Department of Health Care
   Policy & Financing
- Member = person in services
- CCM = Care and Case Management system (statewide Member health record). This replaced the Benefits Utilization System (BUS)
- HCPF = Health Care Policy and Financing
- CMA = Case Management Agencies. Formerly CCBs and SEPs.
- CMRD = Case Management Redesign
- DSA = Direct Service Area. This is how CMRD designated CMAs. TRE works with both DSA 11 (El Paso, Park, and Teller Counties) and DSA 12 (Pueblo County).
- LTSS = Long Term Services and Supports. Also known as HCBS (Home and Community Based Services) or LTC (Long Term Care).
- OCL = Office of Community Living
